## 3. GSK Initiative's Advocacy Efforts in Nigeria

In line with this principle, GSK Initiative has been actively engaging key stakeholders in Ekiti and Ogun states to promote sustainable development and drive positive change. Building on their existing advocacy efforts, GSK Initiative team recently undertook a series of courtesy visits to Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs) in the two states.

The courtesy visits were aimed at strengthening relationships and fostering collaboration with the following institutions:

- Ministry of Women Affairs and Social Development
- Ministry of Education
- NAPTIP (National Agency for the Prohibition of Trafficking in Persons)
- NSCDC (Nigeria Security and Civil Defence Corps)
- Nigeria Police Force

These visits culminated in a significant show of support, with all the institutions pledging their continued backing to GSK Initiative. This demonstration of commitment underscores the importance of collaborative action in achieving meaningful impact and promoting sustainable development in Ekiti and Ogun states.













# 4. Fostering Collective Responsibility: The Welfare Committee for Protecting the Rights of Vulnerable Children in Nigeria.

GSK Initiative recently organized a pivotal event aimed at safeguarding the welfare of street-connected children in Nigeria. In 2024, the initiative took a significant step towards protecting the rights of these vulnerable children by organizing a stakeholders' meeting and inaugurating a welfare committee. The event, themed "Roles of community actors in protecting the rights of children in street situation," brought together key stakeholders, including the Honorable Commissioner for Women Affairs and Social Development in Ekiti State, Mrs. Olapeju Babafemi, security agencies, street children, and Abibat Ogunjobi, the lyaloja of Ekiti State.

The Ministry of Women Affairs' Child Officer, who led the inaugurated welfare committee, emphasized the importance of collective responsibility in safeguarding vulnerable children. The committee's primary objective is to ensure the protection and care of street-connected children in Ekiti State.

The event marked a crucial milestone in GSK Initiative's efforts to address the challenges faced by street-connected children. By fostering collaboration among stakeholders, the initiative aims to create a safer and more supportive environment for these vulnerable children.



# 5. Empowering Vulnerable Mothers and Children: A Pathway to Economic Independence

As the renowned philanthropist, Nelson Mandela, once said, "Overcoming poverty is not a gesture of charity; it is an act of justice." This quote resonates deeply with our mission at GSKi, where we strive to empower vulnerable mothers and children, breaking the cycle of poverty and fostering economic independence.


In 2024, GSKi implemented several initiatives aimed at achieving this mission. As part of its economic empowerment program, GSKi donated multipurpose grinding machines to three mothers, enabling them to generate income and improve their livelihoods. Additionally, GSKi awarded full scholarships to one child from two of these families, covering tuition fees, school uniforms, Exercise books, textbooks, and other stationery.

This empowerment event was attended by representatives from the Ministry of Women Affairs and Social Development, demonstrating GSKi's collaboration with government agencies to support vulnerable populations. Furthermore, GSKi enrolled four street-connected children in vocational training programs of their choices, providing them with skills and opportunities for economic independence and one out of four also showed interest in going back to school which GSKi took upon herself, and got him enrolled.

Through these initiatives, GSKi is committed to creating a brighter future for vulnerable mothers and children, empowering them to break free from the shackles of poverty and unleash their full potential.











# 6. GSKi Beneficiaries Celebrate Milestone Achievements at Graduation Ceremony

In 2024, GSKi marked a significant milestone with the graduation ceremony of four beneficiaries, including two street-connected children, one Orphaned and Vulnerable Child (OVC), and a youth at risk. The graduates, Faith Matthew, Afolabi Seun (aka KAKO), and Olaifa Sunday, successfully completed their vocational training in hairdressing, bike mechanics, and barbing respectively.

During the ceremony, the beneficiaries received their working tools and certificates, symbolizing a major achievement in their personal and professional lives. Additionally, Olaolu a youth at risk received vital support from GSKi, including a clipper and financial assistance, to help him overcome challenges and build a better future.

GSKi's vocational training program aims to empower vulnerable children and youth with skills and resources to break the cycle of poverty and achieve economic independence.

# 7. Listening to the Voices of Street-Connected Children: A Step towards Empowerment

In 2024, GSKi Nigeria held its first quarterly meeting with children in street situations and youths at risk in Lafenwa, Abeokuta, Ogun State, and Atikankan, Ado-Ekiti, Ekiti State. This groundbreaking event brought together 100 children and youths at risk, providing a platform for them to share their experiences, concerns, and suggestions for improvement.

The focus of the gathering was to listen to the views of the children, promote their interests, and discuss ways to enhance their general welfare. This initiative aimed to gather insights on how GSKi can develop a robust intervention plan to support these vulnerable children.


### 8. GSKi's Week-Long Stand against Violence for Hope and Resilience

Relief materials such as school bags, notebooks, pens, socks, school uniforms, and school sandals were distributed to the beneficiaries. This initiative was made possible through the collaborative efforts of the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Women Affairs in Ekiti and Ogun states.
